Deskriptor Ich kann kurze Texte über allgemeine Themen wie z.B. das Leben in anderen Ländern im Wesentlichen verstehen.	
Beschreibung: Die Schülerinnen und Schüler lesen die Aufgabenstellung, vergewissern sich vor dem zweiten Lesen, welche Informationen sie dem Text entnehmen sollen (<i>fact file</i>) und lesen anschließend den Text über die Harry-Potter-Autorin nochmals.	
Organisationsform: Einzelarbeit	
Zeitaufwand: ca. 20 Minuten	
Erfüllungsgrad: Die Aufgabe gilt als erfüllt, wenn 5 der 10 verlangten Informationen gefunden wurden.

- ⇒ das Arbeitsblatt *Who made Harry Potter?*
- ⇒ einen Stift

- ⇒ Lies dir nach dem ersten Lesen das *fact file* durch.
- ⇒ Beim zweiten Lesen weißt du so, welche Informationen du dem Text entnehmen sollst.
- ⇒ Mindestens 5 der verlangten 10 Informationen solltest du herausfinden.

You need:

- ⇒ the worksheet *Who made Harry Potter?*
- ⇒ a pen

- ⇒ Read the fact file after the first reading.
- ⇒ So you know what pieces of information you are to find.

Who made Harry Potter? Meet J.K. Rowling

"I am a lucky person, doing what I love best in the world. I'm sure that I will always be a writer. The greatest reward is the enthusiasm of the readers."

Joanne Rowling was born near Bristol, England. After she graduated from Exeter University, she found work as a secretary, and later spent time teaching English in Portugal before moving to Edinburgh, Scotland, with her daughter. She currently lives in Scotland with her husband and three children.

Rowling first thought of Harry while being on a train in 1990. She worked on the book for several years but a lot of publishers rejected her manuscript before one took interest.

Harry Potter's magic has touched a huge audience of all ages all over the world. In America, there are over 103 million books in print, and each title has been No. 1 on *The New York Times* and *USA Today* bestseller lists.

J. K. Rowling has won lots of international children's book awards as well as many other

honours. She has even been named an Officer of the British Empire.

In 1998, *Harry Potter and the Sorcerer's Stone* was published in the United States, kicking off Harry-mania. Suddenly, kids were reading again, and their parents wanted to read the same books! The second and third books were published in the spring and fall of 1999. On July 8, 2000, the release of *Harry Potter and the Goblet of Fire* became a big sensation, with bookstore events taking place at midnight. The book won the title of the "fastest-selling book in history".

Warner Bros. has made films of all of Harry Potter's adventures that have been published to date. With over a quarter of a billion books sold, the books have been translated into 61 languages and can be bought in over 200 countries.
