Try the Newquay beaches!

Cornwall has always been a popular place for holidays, and each year more and more people travel to this quiet part in the south west of the British Isles to enjoy the county's unique character and attractions.

5 Cornwall has more coastline than any other county in England, and more beaches, too. With more than 300 to choose from, there's almost a complete year of day excursions before you can possibly say you've seen the whole range of what the Duchy can offer!

10 From the east to the west, the south coast gives you beaches of beauty, splendour and an immense variety of superb settings. The north coast has some of the most famous beaches in Europe. You can spend eleven days in Newquay alone without being on the same beach twice!

Seven miles of soft, golden sands make a playground for all ages and a base for all types of water sports. The place is ideal for inexperienced sailors and surfers as well as a natural stadium for national and international championships.

15 Newquay is known as the busiest seaside resort in Cornwall, and certainly attracts the crowds, but even here there is variety that reflects some of what the rest of the county has to give. Some beaches, such as Tolcarne, are very close to the centre of the town, and restaurants, bathing huts and equipment shops are all close at hand.

20 Others, such as Watergate, have been left as nature intended, with no real additions or subtractions to allow for tourists.

Around Newquay there are smugglers' caves, rocks with ancient names and strange formations, wide, empty spaces contrasting with narrow estuaries rich in plant and animal life.

25 Perhaps busy Fistral, a haven for sun-seekers and surfers alike, is the ideal centre for a more thorough exploration of Cornwall beaches.

This is a real honey pot, teeming with people during the summer, but big enough to handle vast numbers comfortably.

30 Around it, to the east and west, are hundreds of miles of Cornish beaches of equal quality, but greater seclusion, interrupted only by cliffs that give more than enough spectacular views to make up for any lack of accessibility and sand! Crystal clear waters and sands as smooth and soft as silk are features of the south coast in particular, with the fantastic scenery of the Helford River only adding more spectacular variety to the possibilities of the visiting explorer.

35 A lifetime could be spent finding your own favourites from among Cornwall's beaches.

What a rewarding lifetime that would be!

But don't worry. If you can't spend your whole life here you should plan a shorter visit to this wonderful region. Come to Cornwall soon.
